## *A Commitment to Responsible Care*

Jevic is proud to be a founding partner in the American Chemistry Council's Responsible Care® movement.

As a Responsible Care® partner, Jevic commits and subscribes to the following Responsible Care® Principles.

- To recognize and respond to community concerns about chemicals and our operations.
- To develop and produce chemicals that can be manufactured, transported, used and disposed of safely.
- To make health, safety, and environmental considerations a priority in our planning for all existing and new products and processes.
- To report promptly to officials, employees, customers, and the public information on chemical-related health or environmental hazards and to recommend protective measures.
- To counsel customers on the safe use, transportation, and disposal of chemical products.
- To operate our plants or facilities in a manner that protects the environment and the health and safety of our employees and public.
- To extend knowledge by conducting or supporting researches on the health, safety, and environmental effects of our products, processes or waste materials.
- To work with others to resolve problems created by past handling and disposal of hazardous substances.
- To participate with government and others in creating responsible laws, regulations, and standards to safeguard the community, workplace, and the environment.
- To promote the principles and practices of Responsible Care by sharing experiences and offering assistance to others who produce, handle, use, transport, or dispose of chemicals.
- To commit to, and abide by, the regulations and laws set forth by all local, state and federal agencies that regulate our business and its components.

We take these principals seriously and can say they are the core of our Hazardous Materials, Risk and Safety departmental procedures. We encourage every one of our customers and vendors to participate in making these principles a reality, thereby insuring a safer more enjoyable environment in which to live and work.

Jevic's environmental, health, safety and security programs are managed by the HazMat and Regulatory Compliance Department and Driver Safety Departments. Environmental, health, safety, and security stewardship are basic principles within the company's operating philosophy of protecting the environment and assets of the organization.

The continuing objectives of Jevic's EHS&S programs are to define, organize, provide continuous training, encourage participation, and proactively manage practices and processes designed to ensure regulatory compliance and minimize company losses.

The Hazardous Materials and Regulatory Compliance Department is accountable for company compliance with environmental (EPA, RCRA), emergency response, workplace safety (OSHA), DOT hazardous material employee training (DOT) requirements, and compliance with Jevic's Loss Prevention and Security Plan.

Environmental programs include a comprehensive waste management plan designed to minimize waste generation through prompt resolution of Overages, Shortages & Damages (OS&D) issues. Priority is given to returning all OS&D freight either to the shipper or consignee. Waste and potential adverse environmental impact as the result of transportation incidents are also minimized through driver training in proper emergency response procedures including the use, where appropriate, of driver spill kits that are issued to all drivers, a 24/7 HazMat department support team of technical specialists, and a contracted, national response network of spill contractors.

The Safety Department is accountable for company compliance with all related federal Department of Transportation, state, and local motor carrier regulations including driver hiring practices, driver qualifications, driver training, hours of service, and logs compliance.

Each department monitors the effectiveness of their programs and maintains performance metrics that are reported to Senior Management.

**Summary of DOT Training program:** Jevic Transportation provides all drivers, operations personnel, data entry persons, and DOT recognized employees with DOT Hazardous Materials Training as required under HM181/ HM126F regulations upon hire and at three-year refresher intervals. The training encompasses safe handling, labeling, manifesting, placarding, transportation, and spill response. In addition, all employees are provided training in Hazard Communication as required under OSHA and Security Training as required by DOT under 49 CFR Part 800, Subpart A&B; and Subchapter C including Security Plan requirements. All our drivers are also Highway Watch members. Jevic is also a C-TPAT validated carrier.

**Safety evaluation and improvement:** Our Hazardous Materials and Safety Departments track injuries, spills, OSHA compliance, chemical releases, etc. This information is documented on internal reports and distributed to interested personnel to determine the cause of the action. Once identified, the cause is addressed in an appropriate fashion to prevent a recurrence.

**Maintenance and equipment inspection:** Our vehicles, both over the road and local units, are on a preventive maintenance program that is computer-tracked by our in-house maintenance department.

**D.O.T Security Compliance:** Jevic maintains a Security Plan and trains all new hires on its use and implementation as required under HM-232. The Security Plan is a confidential document; however, I have attached a letter authored by our Senior Vice President of Finance stating that this program has been established and is in place. I have also included a copy of the table of contents.

**Incident reporting system that track non-conformance:** Jevic has an internal reporting and tracking system for deviations from the company-established protocols. Once a flaw has been found, appropriate actions are taken and documented to ensure non-recurrence.

**Materials transported:** Jevic transports a variety of items over the road. We move the following classes of materials: Class 1.4 & 1.6, Class 2, Class 3, Class 4, Class 5, Class 6.1, Class 8, and Class 9 materials. Additionally, we transport various non-regulated and non-hazardous items such as building materials, equipment, machinery, and food. We do not transport Waste of any kind, Hazardous or Non Hazardous.

The Senior Management staff of Jevic Transportation supports and adheres to the above set of principles put forth by the American Chemistry Council-Responsible Care initiative.
