Re: Jevic Security Plan

JEVIC TRANSPORTATION has written and implemented a Loss Prevention and Security Plan that addresses proper employee identification, hazardous materials en route security, and facility security. This plan also meets the requirements for security awareness and methods designed to enhance hazardous materials transportation safety per HM-232 (now 49 CFR 172.704 and 49 CFR Part 172 Subpart I.)

All employees undergo general security and threat awareness training for recognition and reporting of suspicious activity, proper employee identification requirements, and understanding changes in customer freight shipping and receiving procedures based on different Threat Levels.

Driver awareness training includes en route cargo security procedures including hijacking recognition, layovers, trailer securement (locking) procedures, and theft reporting procedures for the quickest possible asset recovery. En route security measures include the use of locks at all times on trailers, vehicle tracking devices, real time driver communication, and driver situation awareness training.

Cargo theft or threats are immediately reported to the Director of Risk Management who in turn will notify appropriate law enforcement agencies, and the Information Analysis and Infrastructure Protection Center Directorate (IAIP).

Facility personnel awareness training includes site security measures for the building and all equipment on the yard, customer contact monitoring for changes in customer freight shipping and receiving procedures that are based on different Threat Levels, and the establishment of a Control Center of Senior Management to coordinate emergency procedures.

Facility Security measures include site lighting, perimeter fencing, designated employee parking areas, employee identification and facility access procedures, and instructions for incident or threat reporting.


